- July 2013 first NZ UAS Symposium sponsored by Callaghan Innovation and DTA (Defence Technology Agency)
- April 2014 Start-up group UAVNZ mission: To maximise the benefits from UAV technologies and develop a world-class UAV industry in New Zealand
- January 2015 Wings Over Wairarapa UAS Symposium
- June 2015 incorporation as a division of Aviation NZ and its first officially elected committee – 10 members + Callaghan + Aviation NZ
